Start <u>20</u> New Connect Groups (5 new groups a year)


- Avg. Small Group is 15







Unleashing Our Leadership Potential

What is Leadership Potential?

Leadership potential involves showing traits, abilities and characteristics often associated with being a successful leader.

Many organizations look for individuals with leadership potential so that they can build a strong workforce and develop future leaders. However, each person may exhibit leadership potential differently, and if you are in a leadership role, it's important to understand how to identify leadership potential in different types of people.

1 Cor. 12


- "(1) Now about the gifts of the Spirit, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed...
- (4) There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. (5) There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. (6) There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. (7) Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good...
- (12) Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.

Question:

Discovering and developing spiritual gifts are essential to a believer following the call of God in their lives and in this church.

Consider Jesus' Approach to Approach to Recognizing Leadership Potential

Rather than focusing on the masses, Jesus identified 12 men He would personally invest in—3 in His closest circle

- He trained them
- He assigned them roles
- He gave them responsibility
- He trusted them





These books provide a cautionary tale for those prone to go their own way. The God who condemned the idolatry of His children centuries ago still expects His people to walk in holiness today. (13 sessions)







Bible Studies for Life

Never Alone: The Holy Spirit in Our Lives by Paul Kelly (6 sessions)

Understand that we cannot live the Christian life in our own power, but we are never on our own. The Holy Spirit leads us to faith in Christ and empowers us to walk daily in His strength.

How to Love Your Neighbor by Katie McCoy (6 sessions)

Although loving others is not always easy, see how God's Word gives us the guidance we need to love our neighbor even as Christ loves us.

Interdependent Independence by Nick Person (special focus session)

Learn of the freedom we're given in Christ, yet see how love dictates that we often set aside that "right" for the sake of others.
